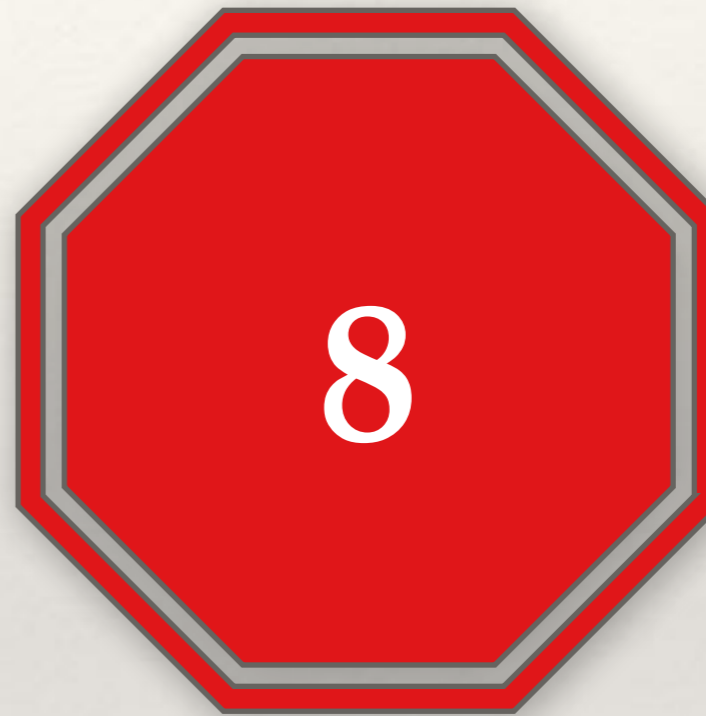
2017 SURVEY RESULTS

24 Years



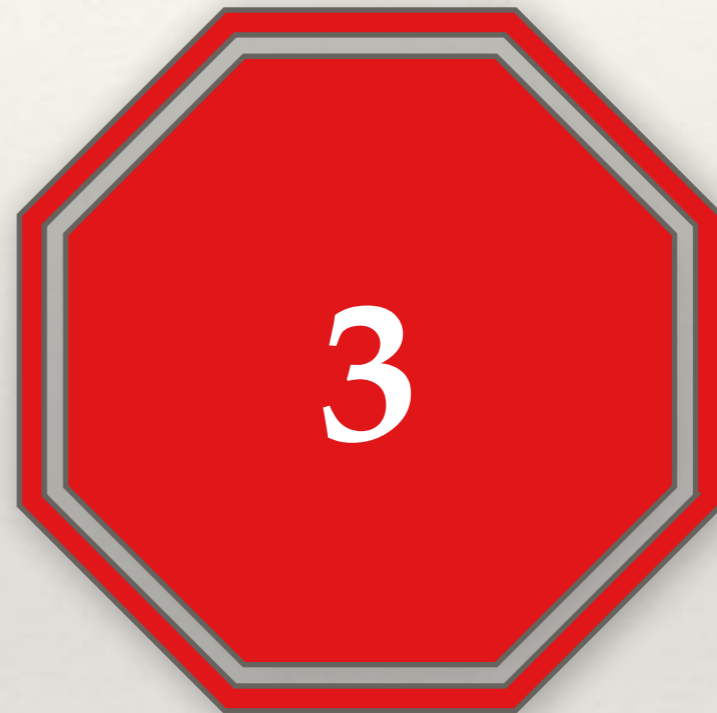
2. Are you aware of visual changes with invasive aquatic weeds?



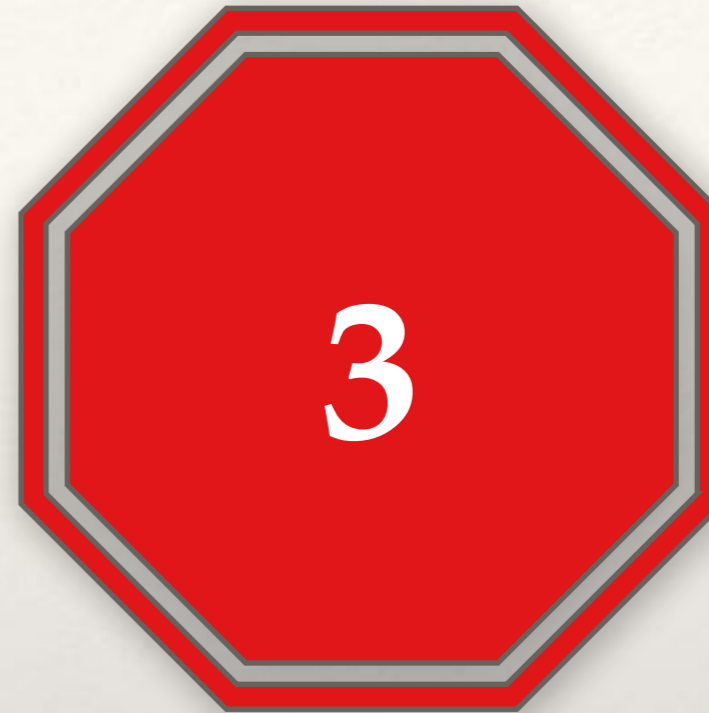
3. Do you want to proceed with a Pubic Act 188 petition and have Newton Township control treatment type, the lake engineering plan and all costs for the lake?



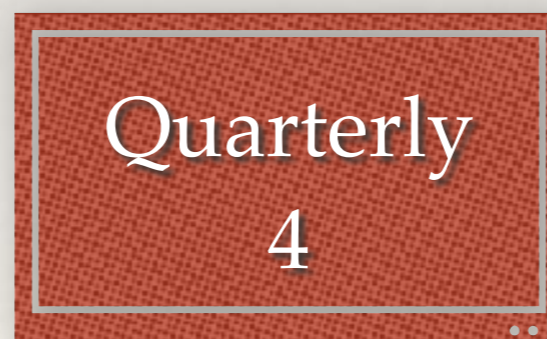
4. Would you want to proceed with a voluntary treatment control project at the control and administration of our Lee Lake Association?

If yes, how would you like to pay:

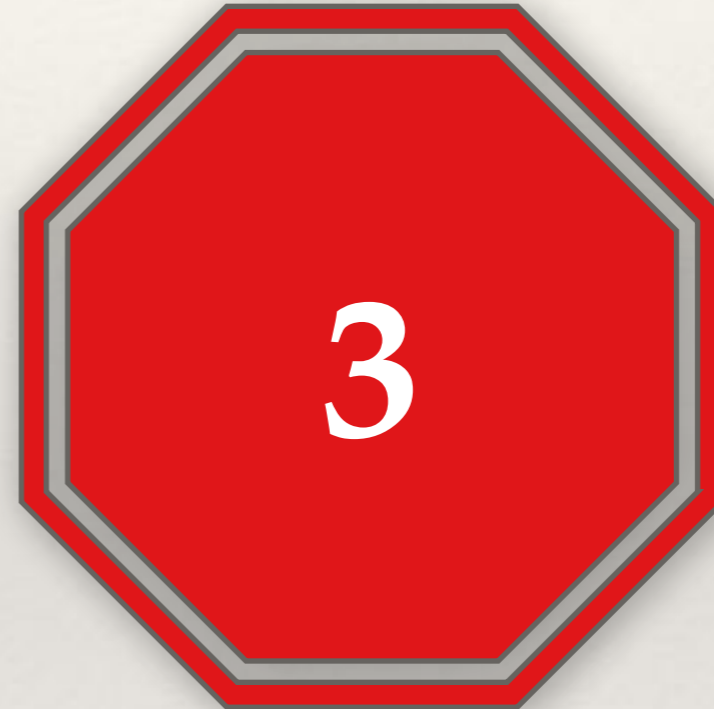


6. Would you agree to the following voluntary payment structure?

Lake access users having access and using the lake pay treatment fee of \$100

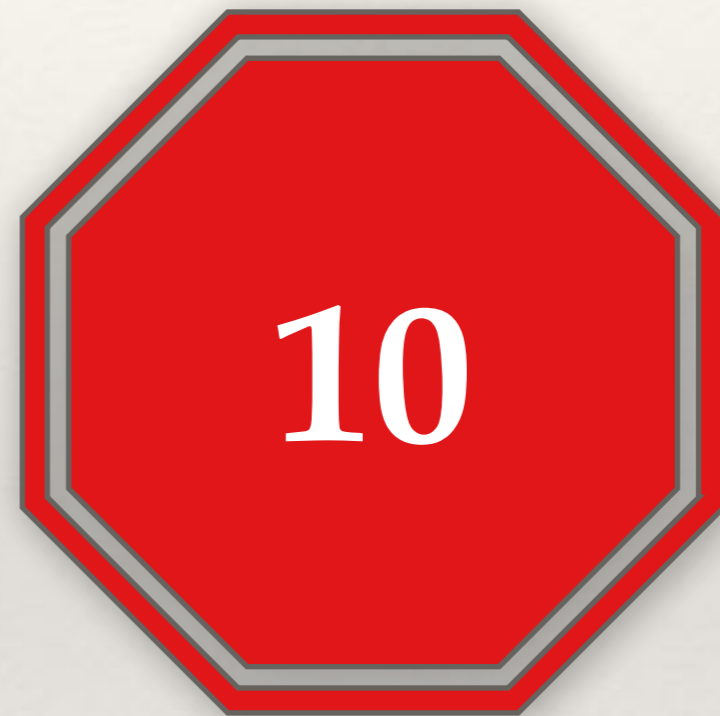
Lots across from the lake pay treatment fee of \$50

3. I'm in favor of either plan. We need to start something as soon as possible. Acting soon will help protect the lake. The weeds in front of our house and along the shoreline are now visible on the surface.
4. Thank you for addressing this important issue.
5. We do not want any chemicals in our beautiful lake. The weeds out in the lake have not changed in the 42 years we have lived here.
6. All the weed problems can be manually removed by lakefront homeowners.
7. If the voluntary treatment option is not supported by the majority, we would also support Public Act 188
8. We are for manual weed removal and against any chemical products put in the lake. We also feel that the Phragmites should be the property owners responsibility, since owners have all ready been approached and paid for removal. If we do a voluntary control project we need to get 100% of the lake residents to participate.
9. The least Newton Township or any government entity is involved the better.
10. Give homeowners information on what will be done on their lake frontage.
11. PA 188 was my first choice until Attorney Bloom told us that ultimately the township has the control over all aspects.
